NH WINTER BIRDS: WHAT 35+ YEARS OF DATA TELLS US FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 13TH, 2026

Join us for a fascinating look at New Hampshire Audubon's flagship participatory science project, the *Backyard Winter Bird Survey*. With more than 35 years of data, we'll learn how NH's winter bird populations have changed over time and how participatory science (also known as citizen science) helps our understanding of these trends. This talk will offer insights into backyard bird identification and what our data reveals about the impacts of a warming climate.

About the Speaker: Grace McCulloch is a Community Science Project Leader and Senior Biologist with the Audubon Society of New Hampshire. Grace earned her Bachelor's and Master's degrees in wildlife and conservation biology at the University of New Hampshire. At NH Audubon Grace manages New Hampshire bird records, NH eBird, the volunteer Naturalist program, and the backyard winter bird survey. In her free time you will find Grace hiking, surfing, and photographing wildlife.
